The Theologisches Seminar St. Chrischona (tsc) takes data protection concerns seriously and would like to ensure that the privacy of users is protected when using its website. The following information on data processing is intended to explain to users in more detail how their data is handled. This data protection statement from St. Chrischona Theological Seminary (tsc) informs you about how we handle data that is processed about you, whether when you use our internet pages or in any other way. We are responsible for the processing of your personal data and the compatibility of the data processing with the applicable law. In doing so, we comply with the applicable provisions of data protection law. The Swiss Data Protection Act (DSG) applies. Specific reference is made to any additional applicable law from the European General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR).

The Theologisches Seminar St. Chrischona (tsc) reserves the right to adapt the content of the data protection regulations if necessary. It is therefore recommended that the user re-visit them at regular intervals.

§ 1 Processing of personal data; nature, purpose and use thereof

The Theologisches Seminar St. Chrischona (tsc) collects, processes and uses the personal data of the users of its website only with their consent or if a legal provision permits this. The tsc will only collect, process and use personal data which is necessary for the performance and utilisation of the supplies and services to be provided by it or which is voluntarily made available to it by the user.

Personal data are all data that contain information about the personal or factual circumstances of a specific or identifiable user. This includes in particular the name, e-mail address, telephone number, address, gender and age.

When you access the website www.tsc.education, information is temporarily stored in so-called log files on our server. This is information that the browser of your end device automatically sends. Namely:

- IP address of the contacting device
- Date and time
- URL of the page accessed
- Referrer URL
- Browser and other device information

The above data is processed by us for the following purposes:

- Connection establishment of the Internet page,
- use of our website,
- System security and stability

The legal basis for data processing is Art. 6 para. 1 p. 1 lit. f DSGVO. Our legitimate interest follows for reasons of IT security. The data processing is carried out in response to your request and is necessary for the stated purposes according to Art. 6 para. 1 p. 1 lit. b DSGVO. You have given your consent to the described data processing in accordance with Art. 6 para. 1 p. 1 lit. a DSGVO.

The Theologische Seminar St. Chrischona (tsc) requires the personal data of users of its website for the following purposes:

- To process online registrations for events (name, gender, email address, home address, telephone number, date of birth, telephone number if applicable and church or community affiliation).
- To answer questions (e-mail address, telephone number if applicable).
- When registering for the tsc circle of friends and agreeing to receive information about offers, the user's address will be used for our own advertising purposes until the user unsubscribes. You can unsubscribe at any time by sending an e-mail to: kommunikation@tsc.education.

§ 2 Automatic data collection through cookies

A cookie is a small text file which is stored in the cache of the user's browser and which enables an analysis of the user's use of the website. The following data is automatically recorded by the computer system of Theologisches Seminar St. Chrischona (tsc) when our website is accessed by means of cookies:

- the user's internet address (IP address)
- browser type and version
- the website from which the user is visiting the website of the Theologisches Seminar St. Chrischona (tsc)
- the operating system used by the user's computer
- date and time of access
- the website from which the user is redirected to the website of the Theologisches Seminar St. Chrischona (tsc).

This data is stored separately from any other data the user may enter on the tsc website. There is no linking of the data with the other data. They are only evaluated for statistical purposes in order to optimise our Internet pages and the tsc offers. The data is deleted after it has been evaluated. If the user does not wish cookies to be used, he or she can block their use in his or her browser. In this case, however, it cannot be ruled out that this will impair the functionality of the tsc Internet site for the user.

§ 3 Retention period of your data

The Theologisches Seminar St. Chrischona (tsc) stores your data as long as the purpose of the storage remains (e.g. study on the online learning platform moodle, answering enquiries, sending newsletters, sending tsc journals or processing registration for events). Should the purpose cease to exist or you withdraw consent, your data will be deleted through the regular deletion run, provided that no legal retention periods need to be observed.

§ 4 Transmission of personal data to third parties

Insofar as this is legally permissible according to Art. 6 para. 1 p. 1 lit. b DSGVO and is necessary for the processing of mailings to you, your personal data will be passed on to third parties. For the purpose of delivering tsc publications (e.g. tsc friends' magazine "Campusleben", tsc magazine "Communicatio", tsc prayer letter, tsc calendar of events), sending newsletters or carrying out payment transactions (payment service providers, credit institutions), the data required in each case may be passed on to further service providers, e.g. Swiss Post or Deutsche Post. Online payments via credit card, Postcard or Paypal are processed directly with our service providers (Postfinance AG). We do not store any online payment data from you. In these cases, however, the scope of the transmitted data is limited to the necessary minimum. The data passed on may only be used by third parties for the purposes stated. Furthermore, we do not pass on your personal data to third parties without your express consent. Insofar as we are obliged to do so by law or by court order, we will transmit your data to bodies entitled to receive information.

§ 5 Your rights

You have the right to

- Request information about your personal data processed by us. In particular, you can request information about the processing purposes, the category of personal data, the categories of recipients to whom your data has been or will be disclosed, the planned storage period, the existence of a right to rectification, erasure, restriction of processing or objection, the existence of a right of complaint, the origin of your data if it has not been collected by us, as well as the existence of automated decision-making, including profiling, and, if applicable, meaningful information about its details (Art. 15 DSGVO). In the event of a disproportionately large effort, we reserve the right to demand proof of identity from you in advance as well as the assumption of the effective costs.
- Demand the correction of incorrect or incomplete personal data stored by us without delay (Art. 16 DSGVO).
- Request the erasure of your personal data stored by us, unless the processing is necessary for the exercise of the right to freedom of expression and information, for compliance with a legal obligation, for reasons of public interest or for the assertion, exercise or defence of legal claims (Art. 17 DSGVO).
- To request the restriction of the processing of your personal data, insofar as the accuracy of the data is disputed by you, the processing is unlawful, but you object to its erasure and we no longer require the data, but you need it for the assertion, exercise or defence of legal claims or you have objected to the processing pursuant to Art. 21 DSGVO (Art. 18 DSGVO).
- To receive your personal data that you have provided to us in a structured, common and machine-readable format or to request that it be transferred to another controller (Art. 20 DSGVO).
- To revoke your consent once given to us at any time. This has the consequence that we may no longer continue the data processing based on this consent in the future (Art. 7 (3) DSGVO).
- complain to a supervisory authority (see below at § 13) (Art. 77 DSGVO).

§ 6 Right of objection

Insofar as your personal data is processed on the basis of legitimate interests pursuant to Art. 6 (1) sentence 1 lit. f DSGVO, you have the right to object to the processing of your personal data pursuant to Art. 21 DSGVO, insofar as there are grounds for doing so that arise from your particular situation or the objection is directed against direct advertising. In the latter case, you have a general right of objection, which is implemented by us without specifying a particular situation.

§ 7 Data security

The Theologisches Seminar St. Chrischona (tsc) has set up technical and organisational security measures to protect the user's data on this website, in particular against loss, manipulation or unauthorised access. The tsc regularly adapts its security measures to ongoing technical developments. We store your data on protected servers as well as the computers on the Chrischona campus. Access to it is only possible for specially authorised persons who are involved in technical, business or administrative support.

§ 8 Privacy policy for the use of the learning platform at moodle.tsc.education

The Theologisches Seminar St. Chrischona (tsc) has created its own privacy policy for the use of its online learning platform. It contains specific regulations for handling the data of users of the learning platform. You can find it at moodle.tsc.education.

§ 9 Privacy policy for the use of Facebook plugins (Like button)

Plugins of the social network Facebook, 1601 South California Avenue, Palo Alto, CA 94304, USA are integrated on our pages. You can recognise the Facebook plugins by the Facebook logo or the "Like" button on our site. You can find an overview of the Facebook plugins here: <https://developers.facebook.com/docs/plugins/>

When you visit our pages, a direct connection is established between your browser and the Facebook server via the plugin. Facebook thereby receives the information that you have visited our site with your IP address. If you click the Facebook "Like" button while you are logged into your Facebook account, you can link the content of our pages on your Facebook profile. This allows Facebook to associate the visit to our pages with your user account. We would like to point out that we, as the provider of the pages, have no knowledge of the content of the transmitted data or its use by Facebook. If you do not want Facebook to be able to associate your visit to our pages with your Facebook user account, please log out of your Facebook user account.

§ 10 Privacy policy for the use of Twitter

Functions of the Twitter service are integrated on our pages. These functions are offered by Twitter Inc., 795 Folsom St., Suite 600, San Francisco, CA 94107, USA. By using Twitter and the "Re-Tweet" function, the web pages you visit are linked to your Twitter account and made known to other users. In the process, data such as IP address, browser type, domains called up, pages visited, mobile phone provider, device and application IDs and search terms, among other things, are transmitted to Twitter.

§ 11 Privacy policy for the use of Google Analytics

This website uses Google Analytics, a web analytics service provided by Google, Inc. ("Google"). Google Analytics uses "cookies", which are text files placed on your computer, to help the website analyse how users use the site. The information generated by the cookie about your use of this website is usually transmitted to a Google server in the USA and stored there. In the event that IP anonymisation is activated on this website, however, your IP address will be truncated beforehand by Google within member states of the European Union or in other contracting states to the Agreement on the European Economic Area.

Only in exceptional cases will the full IP address be transmitted to a Google server in the USA and shortened there. Google will use this information for the purpose of evaluating your use of the website, compiling reports on website activity for website operators and providing other services relating to website activity and internet usage. Google may also transfer this information to third parties where required to do so by law, or where such third parties process the information on Google's behalf. The IP address transmitted by your browser as part of Google Analytics will not be merged with other Google data.

You may refuse the use of cookies by selecting the appropriate settings on your browser, or by selecting the appropriate settings on our Consent Tool, however please note that if you do this you may not be able to use the full functionality of this website.

Within the scope of Google Analytics, we also use Enhanced Link Attribution.

In addition to the purposes explained above, the information you provide will be used in accordance with the applicable Google data protection regulations.

§ 12 Privacy policy for further services and plug-ins for the provision of content on the tsc website

a) Google Maps

Google Maps services are used on our website (e.g. in-screen or via interfaces / API). Google LLC, USA, may therefore process information about your actual location. Google uses various technologies to determine your location, such as IP addresses, GPS and other sensors, which provide Google with information about nearby devices, WLAN access points or mobile phone masts, for example. For the purpose and scope of the data collection and the further processing and use of the data by Google, as well as your rights in this regard and setting options for protecting your privacy, please refer to Google's privacy policy at <https://policies.google.com/privacy?hl=de&gl=de>.

b) YouTube

We use the provider YouTube, among others, for the integration of videos. YouTube is operated by YouTube LLC with headquarters at 901 Cherry Avenue, San Bruno, CA 94066, USA. YouTube is represented by Google Inc. with headquarters at 1600 Amphitheatre Parkway, Mountain View, CA 94043, USA. When you call up the subpages of our website that are provided with a YouTube plugin, a connection is established to the YouTube servers and the plugin is displayed. This transmits to the YouTube server which of our sub-pages you have visited. If you are logged in as a YouTube member, YouTube assigns this information to your personal user account. When using the plugin, such as clicking on the start button of a video, this information is also assigned to your user account. c) Soundcloud

Plugins of the social network SoundCloud (SoundCloud Limited, Berners House, 47-48 Berners Street, London W1T 3NF, United Kingdom) are integrated on our pages. You can recognise the SoundCloud plugins by the SoundCloud logo on the pages concerned. When

you visit our pages, a direct connection is established between your browser and the SoundCloud server after the plugin is activated. SoundCloud thereby receives the information that you have visited our site with your IP address. If you click the "Like" or "Share" button while logged into your SoundCloud user account, you can link and/or share the content of our pages with your SoundCloud profile. This allows SoundCloud to associate your visit to our pages with your user account. We would like to point out that we, as the provider of the pages, have no knowledge of the content of the transmitted data or its use by SoundCloud. d) ISSUU

A plugin from Issuu Inc., 131 Lytton Ave, Palo Alto, CA 94301, USA (hereinafter: ISSUU) is integrated on our website via a JavaScript code, which enables you to call up publications from St. Chrischona Theological Seminary (tsc) such as reading samples of tsc journals, information material and invitations as an e-paper. Issuu uses cookies to analyse your use of the website. Issuu collects and stores personal data in this way, such as the IP address and information about the time and duration of use.
